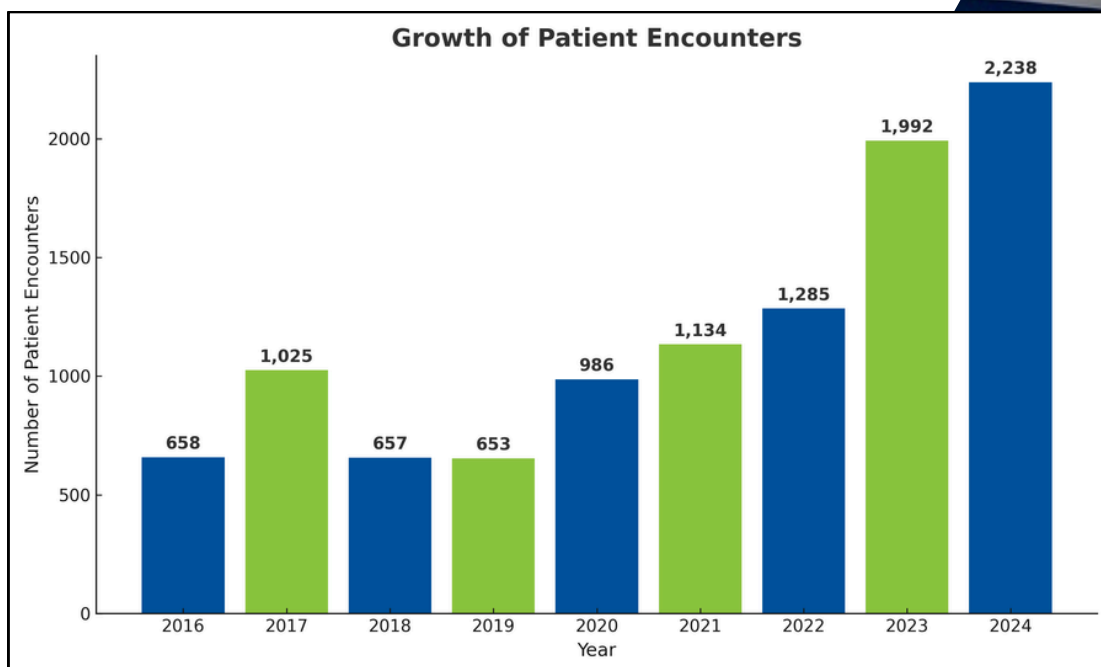
We Have Moved!

In 2024, Beacon Clinic embarked on an exciting new chapter by relocating to a new facility at 2626 N. 3rd Street, Harrisburg, Pa. This move allows us to serve a growing patient base, expand services, and provide an enhanced environment for care and healing.

This commitment to excellence is reflected in our continued growth, with an **11%** increase in patient encounters from 2023-24, as shown in the graph below.

Beacon Clinic's average no-show rate is **14%** for patient visits — lower than the industry average for free and community health clinics. This indicates strong patient engagement and reflects a safe and supportive environment where patients feel valued.

2024 Highlights

Clinical Impact

When our patients were asked where they would seek healthcare if Beacon Clinic were not available, **39%** said they would go to an emergency department or urgent care. The remaining **61%** were unsure or would do nothing, highlighting the critical need for accessible care.

Beacon Clinic's impact on the community and busy local emergency departments can now be demonstrated. **Only 3%** of Beacon Clinic patients had emergency department visits deemed not medically necessary. Beacon Clinic's role in providing accessible, community-based healthcare is crucial.

Finding healthcare: Kimberley

"For the past several years, I have struggled with obtaining health insurance as a cancer survivor. I was diagnosed with diabetes and was able to receive care and medications for free through Beacon Clinic. I am unable to financially afford it, as I am between jobs. I am also learning about proper eating habits and exercise. **Beacon Clinic has been a lifeline and blessing. I am grateful because its love, kindness, and support means everything.**"

Did you know?

- The majority of our patients receive care for chronic conditions such as diabetes, high blood pressure and cardiac disease.
- Among our hypertensive patients, 64% are now within the target range of less than 140/90 — a strong indicator of effective care.
- By providing primary care, the clinic helps prevent hospitalizations and serious health complications.
- We serve Dauphin, Cumberland and Perry counties.
- Our patients have an income under 300% of the Federal Poverty Level.
- 33% of our patients are college graduates, 8% have trade school education or some college education and another 47% have high school/secondary education/GED.

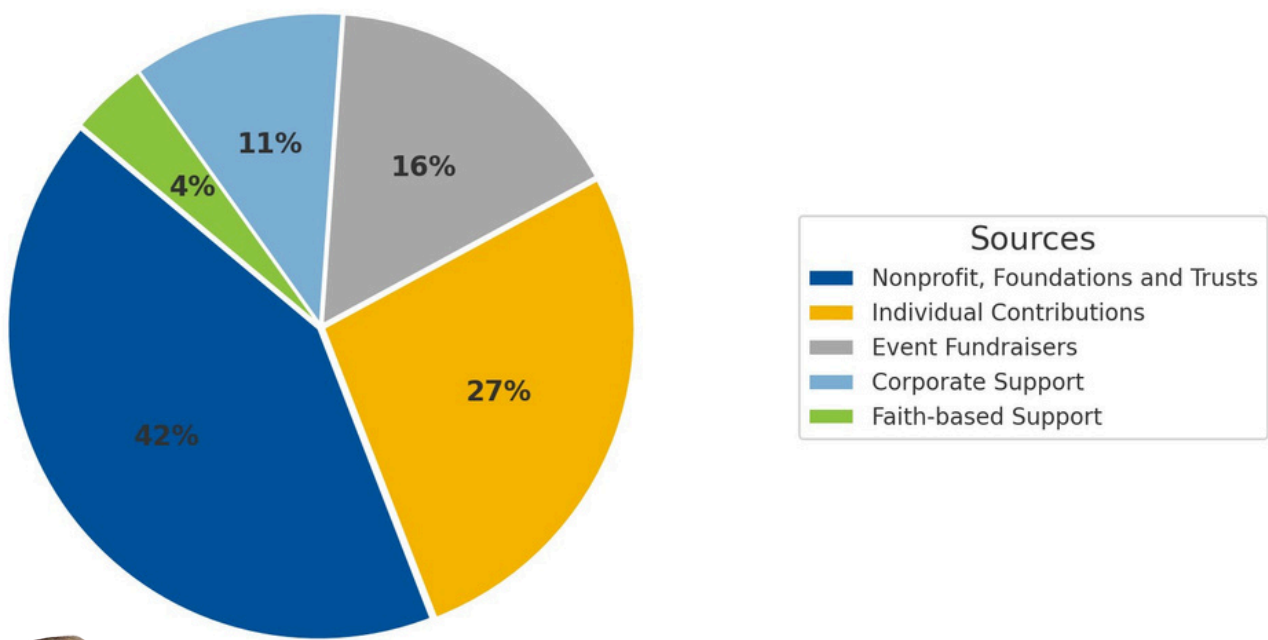

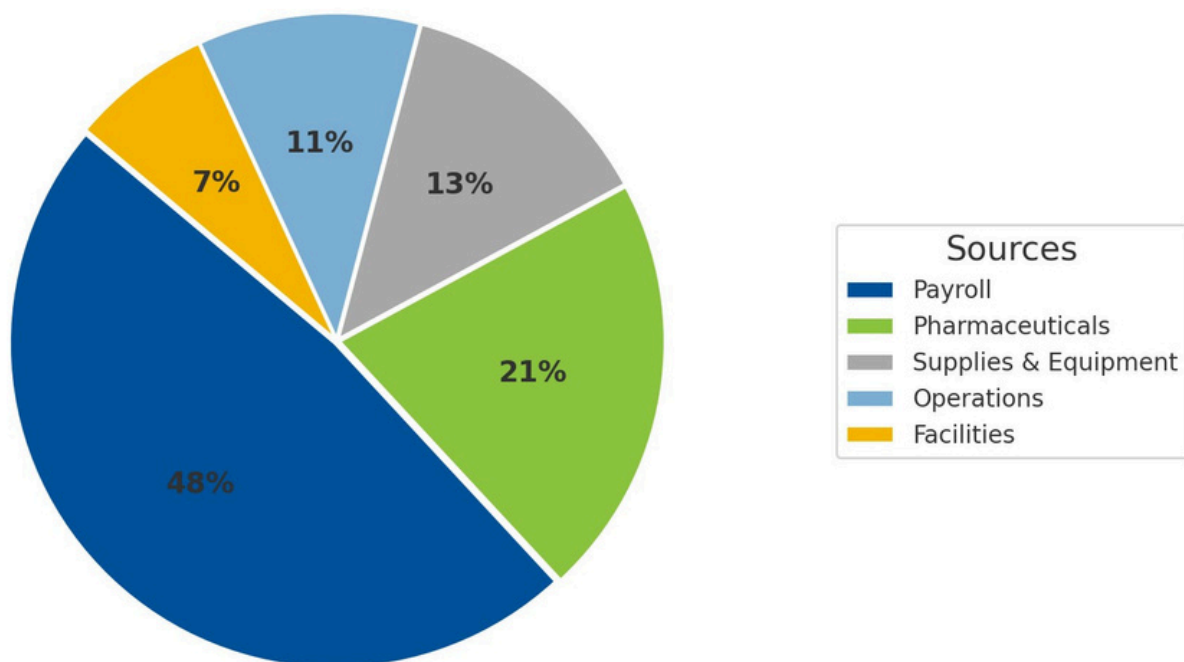
